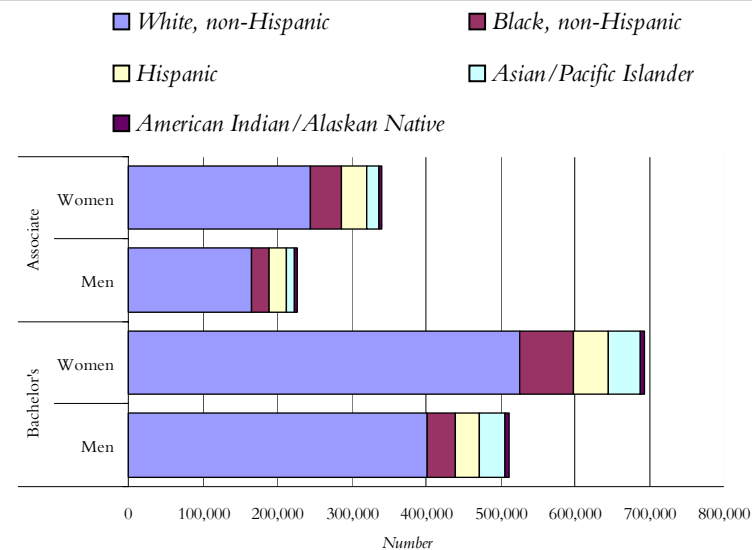


Figure 2-6 • U.S. citizens and permanent residents awarded bachelor's degrees, by sex, race, and Hispanic origin, academic year 2000/2001

Women considerably outnumbered men among the U.S. citizens and permanent residents who were awarded associate (2-year) and bachelor's degrees in 2000/2001. Blacks and Hispanics were slightly better represented among associate degree recipients of both sexes than among bachelor's degree recipients; for example, black women accounted for 12.2 percent of the women awarded associate degrees, compared with 10.6 percent of women awarded bachelor's degrees.
