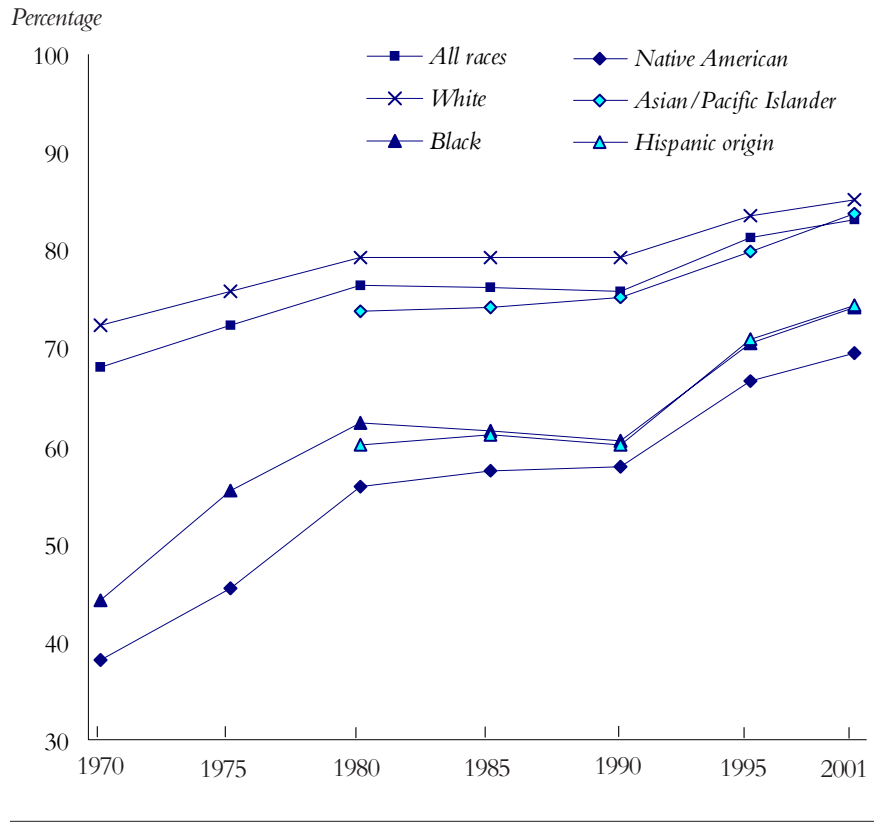


Figure 3-2 • Prenatal care for mothers with live births by race and Hispanic origin, 1970-2001

The proportions of black, Hispanic, and Native American women receiving timely prenatal care increased markedly in the 1990s. Even so, women in these groups were still at least 10 percentage points less likely to have such care than their white and Asian/Pacific Islander counterparts.
